

Please let us know if you have questions or if my staff and I can assist you in any way. Thank you once again for your participation.



# **Chaperone Daytime** Responsibilities:

The teacher will likely assign you a group of students that you will be responsible for during the trip. You can assist the classroom teacher and our Center's staff by helping with the following:

- supervise the courtyard/restroom area when teachers and staff are busy at other locations with students
- assist the staff and teachers in enforcing the student's responsibilities
- supervise restroom breaks and limit the number of children in each restroom to four students at a time
- when your group has been assigned duties please stay with, assist and supervise the group
- please understand that cell phones can distract the students' attention from instruction and programs; we request you turn off or set your cell phones to vibrate during your stay. If you do need to take a call or text, please step away from the group.
- Note: All Charles County Public Schools are non-smoking facilities




## **Evening** Responsibilities:



A campfire program, if conditions allow, is an exciting time for students and is also a time when they need very careful supervision. Please assist the teacher and staff with the following:

- Help with the preparation of the evening snack, campfire and s'mores
- Only adults are allowed to start or add wood to a campfire
- Please keep children from reaching past, stepping through or on the large rocks that outline the fire circle
- the number of students roasting marshmallows at any given time is limited to eight; the number may be lower depending on the conditions that evening





## **Student Responsibilities:**

Please help us ensure the students' safety by seeing that the students follow these rules:

- stay with an adult at all times
- apply insect repellent and sunscreen outdoors and under the supervision of an adult; students are not permitted to apply substances belonging to another person
- walk when in the courtyard/restroom area and when moving from one activity to another
- limit games and the use of playground equipment to the playing field during free time
- refrain from standing or walking on benches around campfire circle; use the entrances on each side
- visit the birds of prey only when staff members are present
- cameras are only to be used in between activities
- rocks from the fire circle remain on the ground at all times
- respect wildlife and their habitats by leaving them alone
